Accountability and Clarity are key!

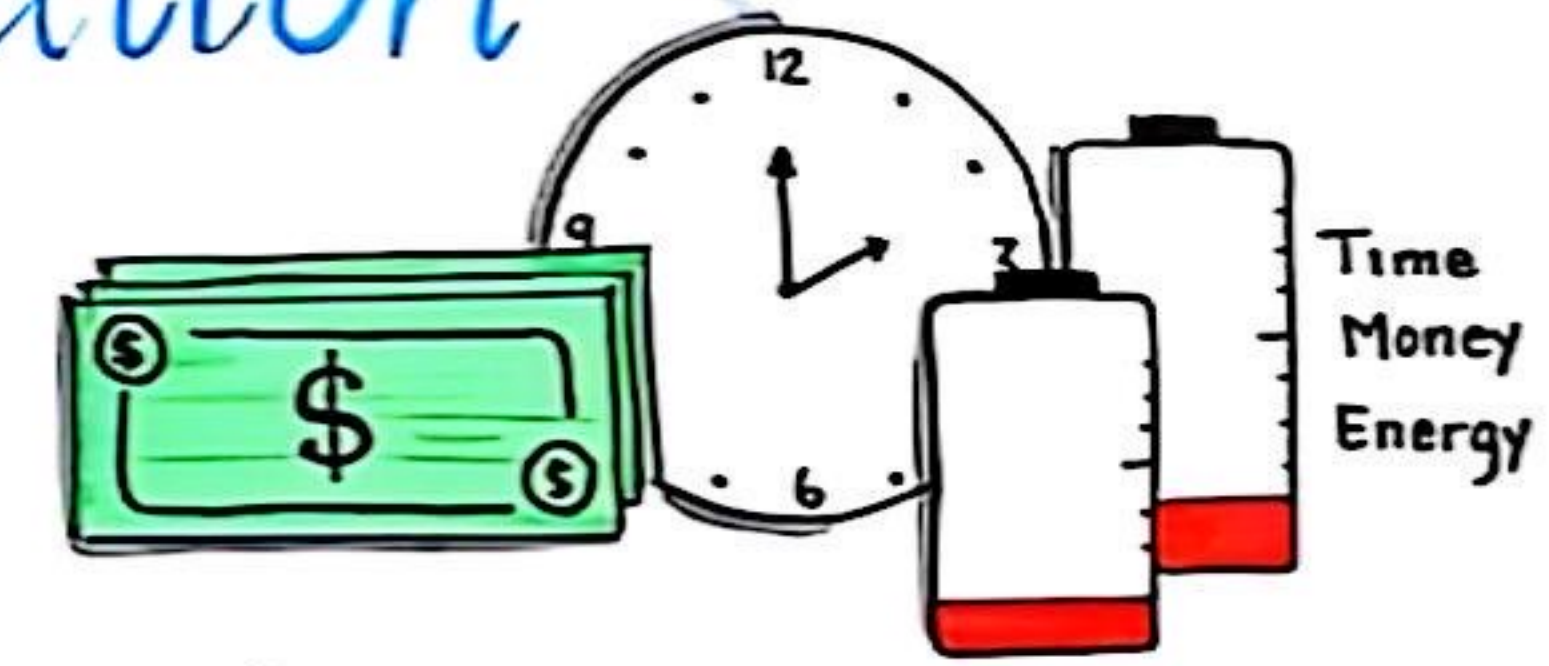
Collaboration
